- 3. John Hyrcanus (c. 164 104 BC)
 - Succeeded by Aristobulus
 - Succeeded by Alexander Jannaeus
- 4. Hyrcanus II: Ruled in Judea 67-66 BC
- 5. Antipater the Idumaean (c. 113 43 BC)
 - Loyal to Julius Caesar, given oversight of Judea
- 6. Herod the Great (c. 72 1 BC)
 - Loyal to Mark Antony, made king by Octavian
 - Matthew 2:1-18
- 7. Herod Archelaus (son of Herod the Great)
 - Matthew 2:19-22
- 8. Herod Antipas (son of Herod the Great)
 - Matthew 14:1-12
